

PARKTOPARK

APPROX: 2.5 MILES

Start at the main entrance of Ward Jackson Park, turn right and walk down Elwick Road. 2 You will reach a lane on your left, named Meadowcroft Mews and Tunstall Hall Lane. There is also a Public Footpath sign. Follow the sign and lane down to an A-frame barrier on your left, over a small brick bridge. Go through the A-Frame and follow the path along the side of the beck for 210 metres. Bear left at a junction with another footpath and cross over a concrete bridge and continue along narrow path. At the end of the narrow section of the path, carry on straight ahead along the side of a young woodland. 4 Exit at Catcote Road and cross over into Family Wood via a gate slightly to the right of the Elwick Road/ Catcote Road 'T' junction.

8 Continue up Valley Drive to its junction with Egerton Road and turn right onto Egerton Road. At the junction with Elwick

and walking along the southern boundary fence of ward Jackson Park, alongside Elwick Road. Re-enter back into Ward Jackson Park. Explore the park or just stop off at the café for a hot drink or snack, or even a nice meal.
